Associate Chaplain's Message

This month we will experience **HOLY WEEK** as we enter into Christ's life, death, and resurrection.

PALM SUNDAY is the beginning of this journey into Easter. Palm Sunday recalls the dramatic occasion when Jesus entered Jerusalem the week before he died. He came into the city riding humbly on a donkey, while the people acclaimed him as son of David, thereby an heir to the kingdom. Later we hear the story of the Passion of Jesus who was earlier welcomed by the people and then condemned by those same people to die on the cross. Our reflection is on the fickleness of our human nature and our own weakness. As we take these palms to our home it is very appropriate to place them in some prominent place to remind us of the story and its message.

On the Monday after Palm Sunday we celebrate the Chrism Mass, where all the clergy and religious gather together to renew their commitment to service, and the people are asked to pray for them. The holy oils that are used throughout the year in the Sacraments of the Church are blessed and later distributed to each Parish.

Then comes **HOLY THURSDAY**, the mass of the Lord's Supper.



The celebrant washes the feet of twelve people, representing the twelve Apostles whose feet Jesus washed at the Last Supper. After mass the Eucharist is taken from the church and placed in the Stone Chapel to be kept there until Good Friday.

GOOD FRIDAY is a celebration of the Lord's Passion. There is no mass this day but rather a service of praying for the needs of the Church and the world. We are reminded three times that "This is the wood of the Cross on which hung the Savior of the world." The Cross is venerated has and each person the opportunity to touch the cross and kiss it as a sign of reverence for this symbol of our salvation. Holy

Communion is also distributed to all the people. The service ends in silence. For some people this day is dreary and uncomfortable, but we cannot skip over this day. We have to pass through Jesus' passion and death and remember what it means to us. The cross is really a sign of God's love for us. It was God's plan for salvation.

HOLY SATURDAY follows. The church is silent, the altars are bare and the tabernacle is empty. We wait in silence at the Lord's tomb for His resurrection. We prepare for the Easter sacraments by prayer and reflection.

At sunset the Church explodes in light and joy and celebration. We come together at this **Easter Vigil** to experience the complete message of our faith, that death and sin have been conquered. Baptism welcomes new members into the Church and the Eucharist calls the whole Church to the table of the Lord. New life and fresh hope have come to us in the **risen Christ**.

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
