SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM JIM SULLIVAN

As many of you know, I wanted to visit Haiti last fall. This was impossible because of the political situation and dangerous times Haiti is facing. Kidnappings in the Port Au Prince area are very prevalent. I was advised by Deacon Mortel of the Haitian ministry not to attempt to visit Haiti at this time. Our sister parish, Mary our Queen, is in a fairly safe area; the problem is getting to the safe area. The roads are extremely bad and travel is dangerous.

You may know that a new regime was elected. The poor people are very much in favor of this new regime. They hope these new leaders will treat them with respect and help them with their problems. Pray that these newly-elected officials will do their best to help the people.

Life in Haiti is hard. The Haitians have a saying, "some days we eat, some days we do not eat." The only real answer to the situation is to educate the people so they can make intelligent decisions when signing contracts and voting for those who will lead them. The illiteracy rate is 80% for adults and 50% for children. Our donations will help to educate the people, train catechists and, perhaps, feed some of those who have nothing.

Your generosity can make a difference. Please remember our brothers and sisters on the fourth weekend of every month. The poor box is allocated for our sister parish on this weekend.

Below is a portion of a letter I received from Fr. Isaac of Mary our Queen.

I sincerely thank you for the check you sent me by way of Deacon Mortel. With that amount, I already organized two catechetical formation sessions for 70 catechists. In addition, I used some for the teachers' salaries. This is because a flood devastated the area and caused the parents to be unable to pay the small tuition we ask for. I am very sorry for this big delay (in responding to you). It is not entirely my fault. I have to go to Gonaives or St. Marc to send you e-mails. It is not easy for me, not only because of my busy pastoral duties, but also because of the bad road. We are continuing to pray for our sister parish during Sunday liturgies. Fr. Isaac"

Associate Chaplain's Message

In this day and age of our society, many young people and many older people have had to relocate themselves and their families to another state and sometimes across the country. The job opportunities are not always in an area where we have grown up and where most of our family and relatives live. There have been a few members of our community at St. Francis de Sales, who have had to re-locate after many years in our community, and had to make a very hard decision about leaving the many friends that they made here.

Establishing yourself in a community is a very important and healthy task if you want to enjoy the friendship and fellowship with people. It makes for a joyful and happier life for you and your family, when we can find the support and care of the community around you. The Church is a big supporter in calling us to worship as a community of believers, and participate in our worship services as a community that is closely bonded together. There are many parishes that have been very faithful in trying to implement this idea and many of them have invented some very

creative ways of enhancing the communal aspect of parish life and worship. As you read through this you will be able to see the many ways that we at St. Francis have implemented these ways in our community.

COMMUNITY

Some of the sacraments like Baptism Confirmation and Anointing are occasionally celebrated within Sunday mass to demonstrate their relationship to all the community. It shows the community welcoming the new born children and also praying and caring for the sick by anointing. Churches have been built and older Churches renovated to provide seating arrangements that allow a better physical and visual exchange between the people which enables the community spirit. More and more parishes have greeters and hospitality

volunteers from the parish who welcome people as they come in. Some of the parishes have books for visitors to sign as they leave, so we can acknowledge their presence in a letter. There are also many churches that have coffee and donut socials after the masses as a regular event throughout the year. Many churches have volunteers to carry Communion to people that are homebound and to keep them in touch with the community and what is going on.

Churches also have many types of social services that help those that are in need of food or clothing. There are outreach programs for those who have lost a spouse, and those who are fighting addictions and many more ways to bring the community together. All this discussion can be looked at as the horizontal dimension of the Catholic Church. Next month we will also include the vertical dimension and see how that also brings us together as one, holy Catholic Church.

ACTIVITY DIRECTORS WANTED

As we prepare for our next Fraternal Year, we are looking for some brothers to assume the role of an Activity Director. We are looking for three brothers who want to make a difference in the council by leading one of the following activities:

Director Family Activities: Lead the council in planning, organizing, and implementing events that the entire family can participate in. These can be fun activities like the ice-skating party or another event for charity. These events focus on mainly involving the families of the council but can also include parish wide – such as the Kids Christmas party. The events are to help strengthen families by involving all the family members participate in an event together.

These events focus on bringing the council brothers together to enhance our comradery, and help us to meet and get to know each other.

The individual does not necessarily have to lead the event. An example is the Council Activity Director organized the Jewelry Show but another brother led the actual event. An Activity Director needs to attend as many council meetings as possible as well as the officers meeting. This normally means that the individual will be attending a meeting on the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Monday of each month.


District Deputy Report
