# **Associate Chaplain's Message**

This month we will continue to look at how the Church helps us to form a good conscience and guides us to use good judgments. We can look at some examples that we are very familiar with to see how the Church encourages us to be able to form a good conscience. We read in scripture that Jesus gave the gift of his body and his blood to his disciples at his last Passover meal and told them to do this in memory of him. The Church, to insure our taking advantage of this special gift, requires at least once a year that we as Catholics receive communion during the Easter Season - from Ash Wednesday until Trinity Sunday.

It also encourages us to receive communion every time we participate at Mass. Another example we see in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Commandment which tells us to keep holy the Sabbath day. That is why the Church requires us to make a serious effort to come and participate in Mass every Sunday.

One last example is where we read how Jesus preached about our need to deny ourselves, and to fast on occasion. As a minimum the Church maintains that we fast two days a year, abstain from meat on the Fridays of lent and have no food or drink one hour before Communion.

There are many complex questions that confront every Christian today that causes moral challenges for us. How do we rationalize what Jesus tells us in Scripture about marriage being until death do us part and the high rate of divorce that we see among people? Would Jesus approve of genetic engineering? Can we really say that nuclear power with all of its risks as well as its blessings, is part of Gods divine plan? These are all complex issues and the Church attempts to address these issues to give us some guidance. The Church on many of these modern day questions of conscience, proposes its teachings after careful study, so that Catholics can resolve these delicate conscience questions. To really know what is right and what is wrong, we have to grow in our faith by listening to what the Church is saying and also to listen to the Scriptures and pray to the Holy Spirit that we will make informed and intelligent decisions of conscience.

At first these standards may seem restrictive but in fact it is just the opposite. The moral standards that the church asks us to follow will actually release us and liberate us. These standards will set us free and lead us to the deep happiness which comes from following God's plan for us. Jesus says to us: "If you live according to my teachings, you are truly my disciples; then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.
