Associate Chaplain's Message

This month we will follow up on forgiveness and look at how the Church has provided us another way to be reconciled with God. In addition to the weekly times that every church has the sacrament of reconciliation, there are several times a year especially during Lent & advent that parishes have communal penance services. These are usually very attractive to Catholics because they have song, prayer & scriptural readings, reflection followed by an opportunity for private reconciliation and absolution of our sins. When we go to a priest for confession we are required to confess those sins that are serious or mortal but also to mention lesser or venial sins so we are able to overcome are shortcomings and to be able to grow in spiritual strength. Before we receive Holy Communion we are expected to confess any serious sins that might be burdening us. During our confession there are prayers that we say but the most important part of our confession is the resolve to change our hearts to grow closer to God. It helps to heal the wounds caused by our misdeeds and helps us along the path to goodness.

I think that we all realize that guilt is a heavy burden for anyone to carry. It is this guilt that interrupts our sleep, takes away our joy, it may even cloud our vision of right and wrong and sometimes drains our energy. The Catholic Church teaches us that God wants us to be forgiven of our guilt and healed of our anxiety. That's why we have this special Sacrament to declare this forgiveness and to assist with this healing and the only requirements are faith in the mercy of God and a willingness to repent. There is also alienation which is also a burdensome condition of life. The church teaches us that God seeks reconciliation not alienation, that the Lord wishes us to make up and start over, that Christ calls us to forgiveness. We are reminded of our need to forgive others just as the Lord forgives us, and to move closer to God and to form a strong relationship with Jesus.

We all know the old adage – the grass seems greener on the other side of the fence. When it comes to replacing your existing Knights of Columbus life insurance with coverage offered by another company, the adage holds true. Perceptions are deceiving. A move to *the other side of the fence* might seem like a good one, bit it can leave you with less *green* in your wallet – in some cases, a lot less. That's why it pays to remember another old saying – *Read the fine print*.

There are many reasons to keep your existing coverage in force, whether that coverage is with the Knights of Columbus or with another company. I'll focus on the potential pitfalls of replacing coverage here - pitfalls that an agent trying to convince you that the grass actually is greener might neglect to mention.

First, all life insurance contracts contain a *contestability period*, which allows the insurer to contest claims made for a period, typically two years, after the contract is issued. Chances are, this is no longer an issue with your current coverage.

Second, it's unlikely that you can obtain the same amount of coverage, for the same premium, that you were able to obtain with your existing contract. The two factors that determine how much you'll need to pay for life insurance coverage are age and health. Certainly, you're older now than you were when you took out your current coverage. There's no way around that one. And you have to ask yourself, has your health changed during that time? Is your blood pressure the same? Your cholesterol? Have you gained weight? All these factors affect the amount of coverage you'll get for your premium dollar.

If someone encourages you to replace your existing coverage, please call me. I'll show you how your existing coverage is working for you and why replacement is not in your best interest.
