On February 22, 1900, the first Fourth Degree exemplification or degree ceremony was held in New York City. The Fourth Degree imparts a lesson on the virtue of patriotism. The primary purpose of this degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism in members and the community at large and encourage active Catholic citizenship. Today there are some 300,000 Fourth Degree Knights out of the total 1.6 million member Knights of Columbus.

Local units, called assemblies, draw their members from Knights of Columbus councils. The qualifications for membership in the Fourth Degree are: membership in the Knights for at least one year and being a Third Degree Knight.

A Fourth Degree Knight may become part of the assembly's color corps. These members are recognized widely by their distinctive attire of tuxedo, feathered hat (chapeau), cape and sword. These members regularly take part in civic events such as parades and wreath-laying ceremonies, and at ecclesial functions at Catholic churches. The various colored capes and chapeau feathers denote different officer positions within the Fourth Degree.

This years exemplification (inducting new members) will be held in Frederick on April 4^{th} . If you think you might be interested in becoming a Fourth Degree Knight, contact Worthy Grand Knight Samis or Worthy Financial Secretary, Brian O'Connor.

This month we will talk about Confirmation and what we receive from this sacrament. We first have to go back to the Scriptures to see where this originated.

Jesus gave a promise to his Apostles that he would give them the courage that they needed to face any fears about carrying on the mission after he ascended into heaven. At Pentecost that promised was fulfilled. Those frightened disciples were transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit into fearless preachers of the Lord's victory over death. Confirmation is seen as that Pentecost event renewed today, as well as a complement to Baptism leading on to the Eucharist. In the early church those two sacraments were conferred together in one rite. We read about many instances in the Acts of the Apostles where the apostles were called upon to lay on their hands to those who were recently baptized. We might explain these two sacraments simply by saying that in Baptism we are made members of Christ's Body and in Confirmation we are given the power of God to bear fruit in our Christian life and to speak before the world boldly and to draw others into the Church. The sacrament is usually given at a time when the child starts to mature and is able to understand what their role and responsibilities are as a Christian.

Our entrance into the Christian life is not a sudden overnight experience but rather a process of gradual maturing. We have to mature spiritually, always seeking to grow in our faith and understanding our faith. The beauty of this sacrament is that the Holy Spirit is given to us in a way that gives us the strength to face up to our responsibilities and share the gospel with others. The Holy Spirit is the one who helps us to grow by strengthening those gifts that we received in Baptism and he is the one who brings them to maturity. Generally speaking, young people receive the sacrament in their mid-teens after one or two years in a preparation program which includes study, prayer, and projects of service to others. When adults are brought into the faith they are usually confirmed when they receive baptism or make a profession of faith. The local priest usually confirms in those cases. There is also a sponsor who ideally is the same person as the godparent for baptism. Their job is to help the one being confirmed to grow and mature in the Lord. Essentially the Rite consists of prayer invoking the Holy Spirit to come upon the person being confirmed. The candidate is then anointed on the forehead with the Oil of Chrism while the celebrant says" Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit."
