"Spouse Insurance"

The death of a spouse is perhaps the most emotionally traumatic event which humans experience. What would you do if your spouse died unexpectedly?

In over 58% of married-couple families today, both marriage partners work at least part time. Often the financial requirements to run the household substantially exceed the income of either spouse alone. Deacon's Report

This month we will talk about the Sacrament of Anointing. This is one Sacrament that many people only think about when death is very near, but the Church encourages us to avail ourselves of this Sacrament when we are facing sickness or are going to a hospital for surgery. There is a relationship between soul and body. Reading the Gospels we can see the many times that Jesus was concerned about people's physical health as well as their spiritual health. In announcing the Good news of salvation, Jesus was saying that God cares not only for our soul but for our entire being as a person. By healing people's bodies as well as their souls, Jesus showed that the entire human being is touched by God's salvation. Jesus healed people's spiritual lives by assuring them that God forgives them their sins and gives them the power to love and care for others. He also healed people's physical ailments as a sign of God's power and his concern for the entire person. We read in Mark's gospel how the apostles were given the power to drive out demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them (Mk6:13). We read in Scripture the question being asked of who is sick? He should call the elders of the church and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick person and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven. (James 5:14-15). The Church's concern is for the entire spiritual and physical well being of the person. The old meaning of sickness as a curse for that person was overturned by the teachings of Jesus. The Rite of Anointing that the Church follows begins with a word from Scripture. Then there is the laying on of hands, which is an ancient Christian gesture which gives special grace of the Holy Spirit. The oil that is used is a powerful biblical symbol that symbolizes the presence of the Holy Spirit. The oil is placed on the forehead and the hands. As was mentioned before, the Sacrament is not only for the dying but also for those who are ill.

The 2nd Vatican Council helped restore this sacrament to its original purpose. They changed the name from extreme unction to anointing of the sick. The Church teaches that the sacrament isn't only for those dying but also for those who are very ill. All of us are challenged to do everything we can to reach out to the suffering just as Jesus taught his followers to do. We all have the opportunity to visit the sick in homes, hospitals, nursing homes, bringing the Eucharist to them and just being a concerned friend.
