### **DOES YOUR GUINEA PIG BITE?**

Last summer St Francis de Sales hosted a Vacation Bible School. The children came to "school" from 9 AM until early afternoon. The theme this year was Jerusalem at the time of Jesus' passion and resurrection. There were mini plays, Roman soldiers, a temple and even a Rabbi. Many of the adult supervisors were dressed in period costumes. Every child was assigned to one of the ancient tribes of Israel. It was quite a production and the children loved it. Many were sorry when it ended; they wished it could go on all summer. One of the most

moving and gratifying features of the week was the Western Wall. The Western Wall was a place where the children and adults could place their prayer intentions every day.

Many of the prayer intentions were everyday intentions. You know, sick grandparents, coaches going on trips, a family where Mom and Dad are not getting along too well and, of course, prayers for those on their way to be with our Father. I don't know why but one of these intentions jumped out at me. It was simple and the letters were kind of crooked, but it was such a statement of faith that I was stopped in my tracks. It said "Dear God, please help my guinea pig not to bite me anymore."

Now on the surface this may seem just a child's prayer. Perhaps this request is a bit too simple .....or is it? This child's faith is a shining example of what our faith should be. This young person, this special child, trusts that God will do his best to help with a very pressing problem: the biting guinea pig! I have a feeling nothing will stand in the way of this little one's relationship with God!

I wish we adults could be so simple, loving and trusting. We are much too busy trying to gain control, be noticed and doing the important things that need to be done. Think about what this child teaches us – to trust in God. This is the challenge before us. Are we ready to answer that challenge or are we content to let it pass by? Pray for this child and the guinea pig too. Pray that soon our guinea pigs (whatever or whoever they are) will bite us and we'll realize that God is waiting to help us! He's waiting for us to trust!
