#### Those Darn Demons!

Jesus contends with many issues, people and all kinds of creatures while he is with us on earth. One of the many things Jesus deals with are demons. During the time of Jesus, if someone had seizures, fits or anything similar, they were thought to be possessed by demons. An exorcist was needed to drive out the demons possessing the person. We know today that those demons most likely were epilepsy, mental illness or strokes. In any case, Jesus is the person who can drive out those demons.

Today's exorcists are doctors and nurses who care for people and prescribe and administer drugs to help them with their illnesses. In Mark's gospel the author uses the healing power of Jesus to prove to his readers that Jesus is the true Messiah. Jesus has power over everything, even those demons who belong to a world beyond Earth. Luke's gospel takes a slightly different view. The author of Luke's gospel, although basing his tale on Mark, portrays Jesus as the healer and benefactor of those who are ill. In either case, we find Jesus helping and healing those who are in need.

In light of these gospels, we need to ask ourselves what or who are the demons in our own lives. What do we struggle with everyday that keeps us from loving and caring for each other? The demons of our modern world are many and varied. Perhaps for us a demon is to overeat. Maybe we abuse alcohol or prescription drugs. Our demons may come to us through no fault of our own, handed to us by life itself.

The challenge of the gospels is to make sure that we allow Jesus to show us our demons and to be our healer in dealing with them. It is not easy to contend with modern-day demons. Trust in God and trust in the healing power of Jesus can help us to grapple with the difficulties of our lives. It is dependence on God that helped the people of Jesus' time. It is dependence on God that can help us today.
