"Baby Boomers"

This month's column is for the baby boomers. Do you know what is sneaking up on you? Retirement! Ouch. I know. It's hard to believe isn't it?

Seems like just yesterday, but it's coming and coming fast. And that's actually the good news.

There's a trend by companies to freeze or end their employee pension plans. This may have a big impact on baby boomers now on the cusp of retirement. Boomers with pension plans have counted on monthly retirement checks at the end of their career, but increasing numbers of employers are ending their plans or halting future benefit accruals. Those at greatest risk include boomers in their late 40's and early 50's who are still at least a decade from retirement but too old to save enough to make up the difference in their pension benefits.

An August 2005 survey by PricewaterhouseCoopers showed that nearly half of companies that expected to change their pension plans in the next year were considering freezing benefits for all employees. More than a third that offered pensions have already pared back these benefits over the last three years.

"This will definitely be a problem for baby boomers," says Karen Friedman at the Pension Rights Center. "You've been at a company under the plan and worked for years with that expectation, and then it's taken away."

HAVE YOU HEARD OF THE "FOCA ACT"?

Caution – This article contains information that some people may find disturbing and sickening

This is what is referred to as the "Freedom of Choice Act." This act is sponsored by Senator Barbara Boxer (D) and the Democratic Party caucus and would remove any and ALL restrictions to abortion at any time for any reason.

This would eliminate any restrictions currently in place due to any state law - such as the requirement for counseling or any requirements regarding notification to the parents of minor children undergoing an abortion. Anyone could legally take a pregnant child to an abortion clinic, even out of state, without having to tell the child's parent(s). With FOCA, all laws restricting unlimited abortion, even those approved by the Supreme Court, would be negated. If FOCA is passed, and Barack Obama has sworn he will sign it, unborn children can be killed and aborted right up to the moment the full term child is delivered. A full term, nine month old baby can be killed and discarded like an unwanted insect. A baby born alive during an abortion will be left to die or killed.

In addition, hospitals and medical personnel that have a moral objection to abortion would be required to perform abortions on demand or specifically open themselves up to civil action law suits or even class action law suits. No Catholic hospital could exist under those conditions. Members of the Catholic hierarchy in the United States have repeatedly stated that they (the affected bishops) would shut down all Catholic hospitals rather than perform these abortions.
