I've heard people say that ordinary time is a little dull and there doesn't seem to be much going on. I guess whoever said that wasn't reading ordinary time's challenging Gospels.

The Gospel readings at this time of year have a message for us to think about. It is the point in Jesus' ministry that he begins his journey toward Jerusalem. Everything will come to a head during this final time of Jesus' life. Jesus will give important teachings to his disciples. He begins to prepare them for his eventual betrayal, death and Resurrection. Most of the people reject Jesus and his mission, and Jesus' refusal to retaliate sets the tone of Christianity forever. Jesus practices what he has been preaching. He will not be deterred from his ministry.

In order to be his disciple, we must make serious commitments. We must do whatever is necessary and not allow ourselves to be tempted into mediocrity or be swayed from our calling. We must set our face forward and answer the call, we cannot look back.


