# Associate Chaplain's Report

#### Persistence and Prayer

How do we know what God wants for us? Should we ask God for everything? How often should we ask? These are the questions of daily life. These are the questions of the spiritual journey. Where God wants us to go is up to him, how we get there is entirely up to us.

In the book of Genesis we are told about Abraham's persistence in prayer. We are struck by God's justice, his patience with Abraham, his tolerance of the people of Sodom. Abraham bargains with God relentlessly. He is pushing God to the limit, yet he is humble and never arrogant. He repeatedly asks God for one more favor, one more concession. Abraham is not annoying to God. He is simply asking God how far his compassion goes. We see by the result of the story that if we ask in humble prayer and often enough, God will respond. The answer may not be exactly as we wanted, that is one of the mysteries of God, but God will answer and grant what is best for all concerned.

Why do we have to be so persistent? Perhaps God wants us to be sure we really want what we are asking for. Have you ever heard the saying, "be careful what you ask for?" How many times do we change our mind?. Maybe God wants us to be sure. Have we really discerned how our request might affect another person? What if our request would not be good for us? If we pray enough, these mysteries might be revealed to us.

How do we pray? The disciples of Jesus wanted to know and this question has been asked thousands of times since. Jesus gives us the perfect prayer – The Our Father. The Our Father is not only a prayer, but a formula for prayer that can be used every time we pray.

The Our Father begins by praising God. Then we ask God for what we physically need and for our spiritual life as we ask for forgiveness. Next we pardon those who have hurt, cheated, or slighted us. Lastly we ask God to be with us until the end. This is an excellent way to form all of our prayers. We praise, ask for what we need, try our best to forgive, and ask God to walk with us forever.

Let's really think about what we are saying and why we are saying it. Let our voices ring out our praise, petitions, and forgiveness. Let us humbly ask God to be with us always. Let this be the day that our prayer life changes. Let this be the beginning of learning to ask and ask until we fully understand why we pray. Let this be the day that starts the journey that will end in union with God!
