On March 23, 2010, President Obama had signed into law the Senate version of the health care reform legislation approved by the House of Representatives on March 21. While several news releases from all forms of media have debated the health care reform issue in terms of its cost, effectiveness, and scope, the Catholic Church's position in the United States was concerned that two basic principals must continue to shape any legislation. A letter issued by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops on March 15th stated that "health care means taking care of the health of the needs of all, across the human life span; the expansion of heath care should not involve the expansion of abortion funding and of policies forcing everyone to pay for abortions." Because of the initial draft which indicated that the bill would expand the role of government in facilitating and funding heath care plans that provide for abortions, the US Conference of Catholic Bishops opposed the proposed legislation.

To gain the Bill's passage and to appease those Congressmen who also shared the same beliefs that loop holes still existed to permit and fund abortions, President Obama signed an Executive Order which disallowed the use of federal funds for abortions. While admirable, the USCCB stated that "the fact that an Executive Order is necessary to clarify the legislation points to deficiencies in the statute itself." The Bishops state that, "they do not understand how an Executive Order, no matter how well intentioned, can substitute for statutory provisions." Since recent analysis of the Bill states that there are weak conscience protection clauses and weak "work-around" funding provisions, the USCCB oppose this law in its current form. They assertively state that "we and many others will follow the government's implementation of healthcare reform and will work to ensure that Congress and the Administration live up to its claims that have contributed to its passage." "We believe that new legislation to address its deficiencies will certainly be required."
