Did you know?

Your great grandchildren may never meet someone with Down syndrome? 90% of all unborn children with Down syndrome are now killed in the womb

While it is commonly believed that Down Syndrome only affects older mothers and the incidence of Down Syndrome increases somewhat as the mother ages, 80% of Down Syndrome cases occur to women under 35.

They cannot accurately determine Down syndrome during pregnancy. There are three tests commonly used during pregnancy but the frequency of false positives and negatives is very high. Only a chromosome study after birth can determine Down syndrome

Most children with Down syndrome have mild to moderate impairments but it is important to note that they are more like other children than they are different.

Anyone who has known a Down syndrome child or adult realizes they are God's special people.

"How Much are you Worth?"

Most men (and women) underestimate their "financial worth" to their families. In my experience as your council's benefits advisor, I can tell you that most of our members (not all) drastically underestimate the amount of money it would take to replace their income.

For example ...how much life insurance would it take to replace a \$60,000 income? At 5% interest, it would take 1.2 million.

 $1,200,000 \times .05\% = 60,000$ annual income

With K of C low cost term and permanent plans available to our members, there's no reason a person can't afford this amount of coverage.

\$1,000,000 isn't what it used to be! Lump sum thinking is dangerous. You can't look at the lump sum, but rather at what amount of income the lump sum could provide.


