#### From the Mouths of Babes

The end of June brought the annual Vacation Bible School to St. Francis de Sales. This year the children learned about Jesus' early life in Nazareth. This was a difficult topic as there is little written about this time in Jesus' life. Leaders, both adult and adolescent, were charged with making this time period come alive for the attendees. As usual, I was amazed at how much the children learned, or perhaps I should say, already knew about being a Christian. The participants were divided into the 12 tribes of Israel. Each tribe was challenged to find a God-moment every day. There were cardboard sheep attached to the walls where the children could record their God sightings. I thought you might like to hear what they came up with: Someone saying thank you. He made everything. I think God is talking to me.... I helped my mom. Cleaning up after ourselves. Puppies. Please and thank you. Sharing our crayons. Being nice. Someone held the door for others. I asked my Dad if he was okay after he got hurt. Somebody took my trash for me. There were many more sayings written on these sheep, but I think you get the idea. The children expressed what they found was God-like in their lives.

One of the big challenges was to see if the children had seen Jesus. There was no one dressed as Jesus. Every day the leaders challenged the children to see Jesus. When they said they hadn't seen him, a teacher would say that he had seen him a lot that day. The children didn't believe it because they hadn't seen him. They asked for clues as to where he might be, wanted to know what he was wearing or if his mother Mary had sent him on an errand. Finally, on day four, one delightful young girl answered: "Yes, I found him, he's in my heart." That was the answer we were looking for. There were many things the children said, too numerous to mention here. It made me realize that the hard work of their parents, grandparents, godparents and teachers had made an impression. Their faith was strong. They had found Jesus.

## "Spouse Insurance"
