Are you blinded?

On the 30th Sunday in Ordinary time, we will witness the Gospel of Mark 10:46-52. It's the well-known story of Bartimaeus, a blind man, who sat by the roadside begging. When he heard Jesus was passing by, he began to cry out saying, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." Many in the crowd tried to discourage him but he kept crying out all the more. Jesus stopped and told the crowd to have Bartimaeus come to him. When the blind man arrived, Jesus asked what he wanted. Bartimaeus said, "Master, I want to see." Immediately, Bartimaeus could see again and followed Jesus on his way.

I'm sure you will agree that this is one of the more moving stories in the Gospels. Poor Bartimaeus, he was probably able to see at one time but somehow lost his sight. He is asking only one thing from Jesus, to see. The story seems to talk about physical sight, but it's perhaps more likely the whole scene is a lesson not to let ourselves be blinded by everything around us. It is so easy in today's world to let our morals be compromised by what's popular or what everyone else is doing. We go along with the crowd because it gives us a sense of belonging. It is important that we discern every major decision we make to assure that we have not been blinded by the selfishness of the norms we witness daily.

There will always be people who take the easy way out. As long as they adhere to God's law, there is really nothing wrong with that. It is only when the law of God is broken, when we think only of ourselves and not others that we are blinded too! It's then that we need to call out "Master, I want to see."

Ravens Matt Birk Tapes Videos for Marriage

Urges Vote AGAINST Question 6

Matt Birk, Center for the Baltimore Ravens, has long been a supporter of marriage as a union between one man and one woman. Catholic, and a married father of six, he taped a series of videos for the Maryland Marriage Alliance urging Marylanders to vote AGAINST Question 6.

Birk's <u>second video</u> warns voters not to be misled by the Question 6 ballot language. "Marylanders should not be fooled into thinking we can redefine marriage and still protect our religious liberty."

"Changing the definition has consequences and you are not being given all the facts when you read the brief language on the ballot," he said.

He also wrote an opinion editorial for the Baltimore Sun concerning the institution of marriage. Birk noted that marriage is more than about two people in love and that "government has a vested interest in ensuring that our children, the next generation, are raised in the best way possible. ... If marriage is only about recognizing the love between two people, then why shouldn't the government bestow the benefits of marriage on two elderly sisters living together?"

"We applaud Matt's decision to speak out and support marriage as a union between one man and one woman," said Derek McCoy Chairman of the Maryland Marriage Alliance, "Matt's views are held not only by the vast majority of Catholics, but also by most Americans."

Birk, a Harvard graduate, was drafted into the NFL in 1998 and began his career with the Minnesota Vikings. In 2012, he was named NFL Man of the Year.
