The Dishonest Steward

A few weeks ago in Luke's Gospel on the 25th Sunday of Ordinary time, we heard the story of a steward who worked for a rich man. In the story, the steward was dealing with his master's property and goods inappropriately. The rich man caught him in the act and told him to be prepared to find employment elsewhere. The steward was really in a tight spot as he was not strong enough to do manual labor and too prideful to beg for his daily bread. He decided to reduce the debt of those folks who owed the rich man money in hope that they would look kindly on him after he had lost his job. He reduced the debt for three of the debtors that we know of. Probably many more received favors at this time. The ironic part of the story is that his master compliments him for acting prudently. Not the behavior we would expect for someone who has been cheated.

We're not really sure what happened that day. Perhaps the steward gave his commission to the debtors. Maybe he overcharged the debtors to begin with and only gave back the amount he overcharged. We're really not sure. We do know the master is not angry with what he has done. So it's a pretty safe bet that he didn't give away any of the master's resources. The fact of the matter is he probably gave back what wasn't his to begin with. His motive of course was to save his own skin. In the process he helped those who owed his master money. The debtors got a break. If they owed money to begin with, it's safe to say they were not rich people. The discount could have saved them from ruin. It may have made them a small profit. And most of all, it may have given them hope to keep on keeping on. Was the man justified in reducing debt just to save his own skin? That's a question we'll all wrestle with. I do know, in the end, he was charitable with the debtors. He helped those who were down and out while helping himself at the same time.

The question we need to ask ourselves in light of this story from Luke is: are we doing enough for those who have less than we have? Could we do more? Could we be like the steward doing the best we can in a bad situation? Will charity and hope heal those we offer it to and heal our own wounds too? The Gospel from the 25th Sunday of Ordinary time places numerous challenges before us. What will we do with message? How will we grow from hearing this story?

Do You Know The Signs Of A Stroke?

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke...totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours, which is tough.

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke. You can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

- 1. Ask the individual to SMILE.
- 2. Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently) (i.e. Chicken Soup)
- 3. Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.
- 4. New Sign of a Stroke ----Ask the person to 'stick' out his tongue. If the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other that is also an indication of a stroke. If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call emergency number immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.


