## ASSOCIATE CHAPLAIN'S REPORT

"JUST WAGES?"

I'm sure you remember the parable Jesus told about workers going to a landowner's vineyard at various times of the day. In case you want to read the story, it is Matthew 20: 1-16.

There was a landowner who went to town early in the morning and found people who wanted to work. He hired them to go into his vineyard and harvest the crop. I guess he didn't get enough workers the first time around so he went out a little later and found more. He hired them too. A little later the same thing happened. Finally, he went out around 5 o'clock and found more people to put to work.

When it came time to pay wages at the end of the day, the landowner told his steward to pay everyone the same amount of money. As you can imagine, the people who worked all day thought they would get paid more than those who started just an hour before the end of the workday. Matthew says they "grumbled" against the landowner.

The landowner explained to them that it was his money, and he could spend it anyway he wanted. It really shouldn't matter to them what he paid anyone else as long as they received a just wage.

This is a difficult parable to understand. I have heard some different ideas about how we might look at it. The first explanation is that this parable could be compared to having three children. One is nine years old, another is six, and one is three. If you are a good and loving parent, you couldn't possibly love one child more than another just because he's older, could you? Of course not! We love our children equally. Maybe each in their own way, but certainly not one more than another. God loves us all equally – the good, the bad, and those in between.

The second explanation I heard was that this parable could be compared to giving people what they need. Maybe the people who went to work at 5 o'clock needed the same amount of money as those who went to work at 9 o'clock in the morning. Wouldn't that be just like God to give us what we need rather than what we want?

We spend a tremendous amount of time worrying about what other people have and what we don't. Maybe Jesus is trying to tell us that we need to be concerned about what we need and not what we want. Perhaps Jesus is trying to tell us that our relationship with him should be the most important thing in our lives. It really doesn't matter what anyone else has as long as we keep working to be more like Jesus every day.

## SUPREME NEWS AND EVENTS

"SUPREME KNIGHT REPORTS ON RECORD GROWTH IN CHARITY AND MEMBERSHIP"

The Knights of Columbus has set a new record in charitable giving, is continuing to experience membership growth, and has established a new council in South Korea, said the organization's supreme knight in his annual report to the Knights' 132nd annual international convention in Orlando.

"Florida is a fitting place for us to remember the great Catholic contribution to our hemisphere," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson as he opened his report. "Before the colonies of Jamestown and Plymouth, the first permanent European settlement was here in Florida, and it was Catholic."

The supreme knight spoke to an audience of nearly 90 archbishops and bishops, including 11 cardinals, scores of clergy and approximately 2,000 members of the Knights and their families from throughout North and Central America, the Caribbean, Africa, Asia and Europe.



The theme of the annual convention -- "You Will All Be Brothers: Our Vocation to Fraternity" — was drawn from the message of Pope Francis for the World Day of Peace, in which the Holy Father observed: "Without fraternity it is impossible to build a just society."

"This sense of fraternity is at the foundation of our call," said Anderson. "Our charitable activity is all the more effective because it is supported by our fraternal brotherhood."

For the 14th consecutive year, Anderson reported, the Knights set a new record in charitable giving, with over \$170 million and 70.5 million hours of voluntary service given during 2013. According to independent sector, the time donated by Knights to charity was worth more than \$1.6 billion.

In addition, "During the fraternal year ending June 30, our membership grew for the 42nd consecutive year," said Anderson. The Knights now has more than 1.8 million members.
