The Exemplification of the Fourth Degree will be on Saturday March 7, 2015 at the Holiday Inn and Conference Center in Frederick. All Third Degree Knights are eligible and encouraged to move up to the Fourth and highest level of Knighthood. Applications are due to the Faithful Comptroller of the Archbishop John Carroll Assembly no later than February 9. The Initiation Fee is \$70 and dress for the Exemplification is Tuxedo. The Initiation Fee includes a ticket to the banquet. Saturday evening. The Assembly always hosts a hospitality suite for gathering and refreshments on Friday and Saturday. Room reservations must be made via the Assembly with a deadline of January 23rd. Cost is @104 per night, plus taxes.
