The Widow

In the reading 1st Kings 17:10-16 we hear the story of Elijah and the widowed woman. God told Elijah to go to Zarephath and find a widow to care for him. Elijah is in exile because he spoke without hesitation about the policies and practices of King Ahab and his wife Jezebel. King Ahab and his wife would like nothing better than to see Elijah dead.

Elijah comes across the woman as he enters the area and tells her to bring him a cup of water and a bit of bread. The woman responds that she has nothing baked and has only a little bit of flour and a little oil in the jug. She was just about to prepare something for her and her son to eat and then they will die. Elijah tells the woman not to be afraid but to go ahead and make the meal for her and her son, however, to first make him a little cake. The woman does exactly as Elijah requests. After it was all over she had enough flour and oil for her and her son to eat for a whole year.

What a beautiful story of faith in God. I think sometimes what stands between our faith and trust in God is that we want God to answer the way we want him to rather than accept what he wants to give us. This is not an easy task. It's difficult to put faith in something we cannot see or touch. What it takes is constantly asking God to show us how to believe in him fully and without fear. This is a lifelong work! What better time to start than today? What better time to put our faith in God and ask him to help us develop it?




The Knights of Columbus invite all children in grades 1-8 to participate in the "Keep Christ In Christmas" poster contest.

Eligibility Children in grades one through eight.

Categories

- 1 - Grades one through three.
- 2 - Grades four through six.
- 3 - Grades seven and eight.

Theme All posters must express the theme "Keep Christ in Christmas".

Poster Size Poster board or paper measuring approximately 12 inches by 18 inches.

Medium Poster board or paper measuring no more than 12 x 18. Water color, crayon, ink, or any combination thereof. **NO computer graphic: no pictures from books, magazines, etc.;** **no collage.**

Judging The following criteria will be used to judge the posters:

1. Expression of the Theme.....20%
2. Originality.....35%
3. Artistic Quality and Presentation.....45%

BUILDING THE DOMESTIC CHURCH WHILE STRENGTHENING OUR PARISH



The following are excerpts from Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori's remarks to state deputies, June 10, 2016.

“If we are serious about moving ahead with what God has given us through the ministry of our founder, Father McGivney, then we will recognize that more is required of us. ... We all need to pay close attention to Bishop Thomas Olmsted's pastoral letter addressed to the men of his diocese, an exhortation titled *Into the Breach*. When I began reading his letter I couldn't put it down. It is perfectly suited to the mission of the Knights of Columbus as envisioned by Father McGivney — to bring about the conversion and spiritual growth of ourselves and our fellow Knights. Bishop Olmsted has given us a guide on what it truly means to be a Catholic man who follows Christ, pays attention to the witness of the saints, understands what he is called to be and to become, and is willing to engage in the spiritual warfare necessary to be a good husband, father and disciple who spreads the Gospel by word and by example. This letter, I would suggest, will go a long way in helping all of us guide the Order in our




