- 1) Please read application carefully and answer all questions fully.
- 2) For high school students: If the student is awarded funds from the State Council, no funds will be awarded from Fr. Maurice J. Wolfe Charity Corp.
- 3) Current or past recipients of the Fr. Maurice J. Wolfe Charity Corporation scholarship must also follow these guidelines if they wish to be eligible for funds for the current year.
- 4) Eligibility is extended to any active member, or child, or grandchild of an active member of Father Wolfe Council #11372 planning to attend a four-year Catholic High School, four-year baccalaureate program or technical vocational program. All dues of the member/sponsoring members must be current.
- 5) Only one scholarship per family or sponsoring member will be granted.
- 6) An updated transcript from the student's college or high school (on school letterhead) is required.
- 7) For first year applicants, a letter of recommendation from an adult (non-family member) who has knowledge of the services you have provided to your school, church, and/or community.

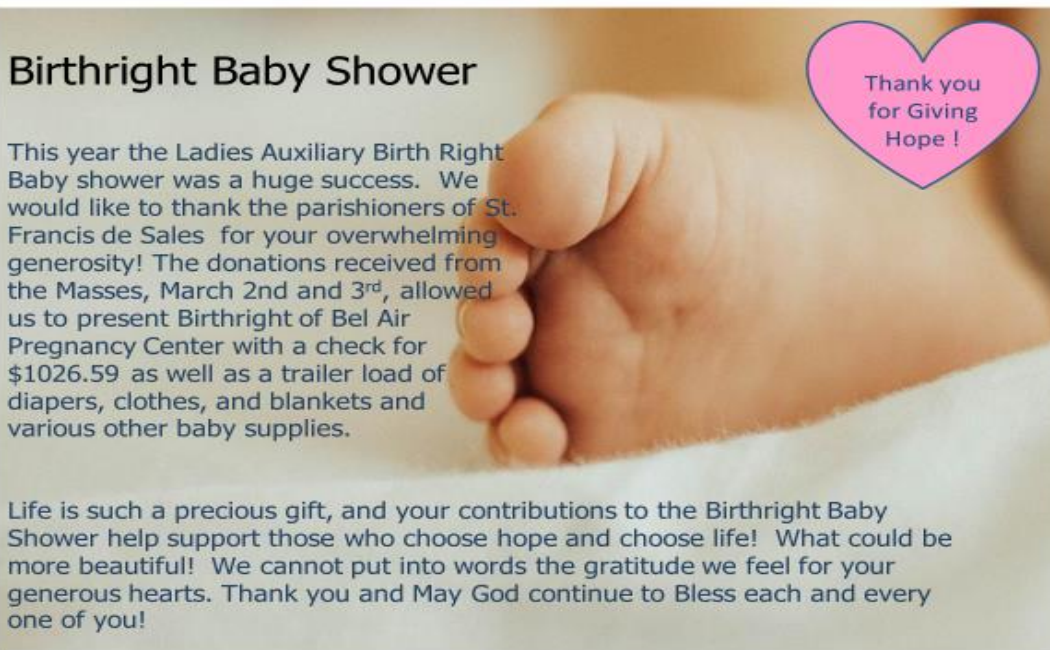
Knights of Columbus Ladies Auxiliary Quarterly Newsletter

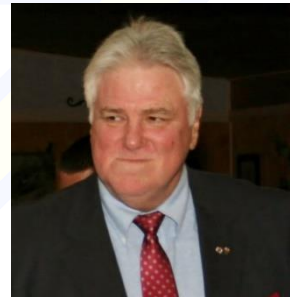

Worthy Brothers. I bring you greetings from our State Deputy, Dale W. Trott and the Maryland State Council. For weeks, in-person Masses have been cancelled in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19, and without regular attendance, many parishes have suffered a loss of financial support. But the Knights of Columbus are there to help. As leaders, Knights are responsible for placing the faith at the center of our families' lives. Therefore, we are making sure our parishes will still be afloat once the pandemic is over.

The Knights have expanded our Church Loan Program, offering low-interest lines of credit up to \$1,000,000 per diocese. Our councils have also been encouraged to support religious life in their local community, as part of our Leave No Neighbor Behind Initiative.



Here are other ways Knights have been helping strengthen parishes and religious communities:

1. To assist our clergy whenever and wherever possible.
2. To support our Brother Knights by making calls to assess if a member needs assistance.
3. By encouraging Councils across our nation and state to initiate food drives to assist food banks and parish food pantries in their areas.
4. To support your communities by reaching out and assisting those who are unable to leave their homes, shopping for them when you do your own shopping or by picking up a prescription for them.
5. To participate in/ or sponsor Blood Drives

There is a powerful line from the Old Testament, it is a line from Joshua, the successor to Moses, who is tasked with leading the Israelites into the Promised Land. After recounting the many good works of God, Joshua says to the people: "But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" (Josh. 24:15, NKJV). “I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly.” (Gospel for May 3, Jn 10:9-10)

We've all gone through times when it seems like we're just keeping our head above water, or moments when we feel overwhelmed by life. So what does Jesus mean when he says that he came in order that we might have life “more abundantly”? Some think that Jesus is offering a “prosperity gospel” that awards the faithful with happiness, good health and financial success. Yet Christ experienced suffering, as do his followers, so an “abundant life” must mean something else. Whether a given day brings health and success, or trials and suffering, we experience all these things with Christ. By living our lives for Christ, he shows us the way to fullness of life.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month I challenge you to write down Psalm 27:1 — “The Lord is my light and my salvation” — put it up where you'll see it daily (on the fridge, on your mirror, etc.), and recite it regularly. Second, I challenge you to promote the cause of life by participating in the Faith in Action Ultrasound or Pregnancy Center Support programs or by making a donation to a pregnancy center.

Questions for Reflection:

What obstacles do you face in living with more abundance, generosity and magnanimity? Has reminding yourself that God is your light and salvation helped you to live more abundantly? How does supporting the pro-life cause help you, others and our society live more abundantly?
